### CROWNS , FIXED BRIDGES AND DENTAL IMPLANTS

A dental bridge is a common, affordable, time-tested, and low-risk treatment for missing teeth. The dental bridge is so called because it literally bridges the gap created when teeth are lost. The typical bridge comprises one or more artificial teeth, known as pontics, which are held in place by two dental crowns, or abutments.

### Dental Bridges - Cost, Types of Bridges & Risks

If the front tooth number 20 of this bridge is sound, it is possible to section your Bridge between number 20 and number 19 and remove tooth number 18. You cannot leave tooth number 19 attached to tooth number 20 or the laws of physics will cause tooth number 20 to fail quite rapidly.

### Extracting a tooth that's part of a bridge.

There are several types of fixed dental bridges (cannot be removed), including conventional fixed, cantilever and resin-bonded. Typically, conventional and cantilever bridges require shaping of the teeth surrounding a missing tooth. Crowns are then placed on the shaped teeth and attached to an artificial tooth (called a pontic).

The "traditional bridge" is the most popular type and is usually made of porcelain fused to metal. This type of bridge consists of two crowns that go over two anchoring teeth (abutment teeth) and are attached to pontics (artificial teeth), filling the gap created by one or more missing teeth.
