#### **Nursing Practice and Research - Nurses in AIDS Care**

Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) is a condition caused by the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). AIDS is potentially life-threatening because it hinders the body's ability to fight disease. HIV/ AIDS has no cure but many people with it can lead active lives for long periods of time.

#### **How to Care for Someone With AIDS at Home (with Pictures)**

Nursing management related to educating patients and families regarding HIV disease includes the following: (1) assessing the patient's understanding and knowledge of OI or HIV-related conditions, diagnostic procedures, treatment, transmission- and risk-reduction activities, infection-control measures at home, nutrition, self-care activities, concerns and fears related to HIV disease or the current hospitalization, continuing care needs or resources, ability to read and write, hand-eye ...
