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4. Keep going. Continue the these baby or child CPR steps until you see obvious signs of life, like breathing, or until an AED is ready to use, another trained responder or EMS professional is available to take over, you're too exhausted to continue, or the scene becomes unsafe.

Begin CPR Check for a pulse on the side of the neck. Feel for a pulse for at least 5 seconds but NO MORE THAN 10 seconds. To check for a carotid pulse, slide 2 or 3 fingers into the groove between the trachea (windpipe) and the neck muscles at the side of the neck.

High quality compressions in CPR should be a minimum of 1/3 the AP diameter of the chest, or approximately 1 1/2 inches in infants (4 cm) and 2" in children from age one to adolescence. The rate of compressions should be 100-120 per minute. Chest recoil should be complete between compressions.

BLS Pediatric Algorithm - ACLS

Rescue breathing during CPR with an advanced airway: 12-20 breaths per minute Chest compressions should be given continuously at a rate of 100 to 120 per minute.

PALS Algorithms 2020 (Pediatric Advanced Life Support)

Victims beyond puberty (eg, adolescents) are considered adults. 8,55. AHA basic life support guidelines for infants and children set the compression ratio 30 compressions to 2 breaths for a single rescuer, whereas the ratio becomes 15 compressions to 2 breaths if 2 rescuers are present.

Interim Guidance for Basic and Advanced Life Support in ...

To evaluate the association between cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) quality and hemodynamic measurements during in-hospital pediatric cardiac arrest. We hypothesized that AHA recommended CPR rate and depth targets would be associated with systolic blood pressures ≥ 80 mmHg and diastolic blood pressures ≥ 30 mmHg.

CPR for an Infant If providing CPR for an infant the ratio of compressions to breaths remains the same but the method of performing compressions changes. For an infant you should use 2-3 fingers in the center of the chest on the lower half of the breast bone to compress the chest about 1 1/2".

The order of the different steps for performing CPR has always been A-B-C, which represents the order airway, breathing, and compressions. This was the accepted best practice up until 2010 when the American Heart Association made revisions to the order of the steps.
